CEO'S MESSAGE

celebrate various communities. We see many cultures and many backgrounds come together and celebrate their diversity and a sense of uniqueness. In this edition, we also feature the donation of three more buses to sleepbus. Today, more than ever many people are doing it tough, and it is a small donation that makes a large difference in many people's lives. The grocery stores are more expensive than ever, and I can never understand why prices would just increase without any real rationale. I would like to share a real story with vou. When I was much vounger, I worked in the dairy industry and in a room where we packaged butter. In this one large room, we would pack many different brands of butter every day. The butter within many of the brands would all come out of the same hopper. We would essentially pack the same butter in the package paper, polished parchment, or foil wrap to signify the brand. So now, whenever I go to the supermarket and see the disparity of all the different brand prices I can never understand why! My suggestion is to try that second-tier brand because it could just be better than the more expensive brand.

In March we celebrated International Women's Day, and this is very important to recognise. CDC, the bus industry, and the broader community clearly need to see more women in our business, and we need to actively promote this and break down any perceived barriers. Please spread the word through your network.

We are hopeful this additional presence will influence better behaviours on our network.



MAY LIM Charter Service Representative Sunshine depot, CDC Victoria



Paul worked closely with the renowned Benders Diesel Service, which was a retail extension of Benders Busways that serviced and repaired trucks, tractors, forklifts, and farm equipment & sold new trucks. When the retail section wound down, Paul was offered a position driving buses for about 6 months which ended up extending up to 4 long years. Around the same time, a vacancy came up in the bus workshop and Paul decided to give it a shot. And the rest, as they say, is history!

While growing older and wiser over the years, Paul has seen the depot through its best and worst. He says, *"I've seen new buses come and go, and I've had a bit to do with all of them"*. Speaking of his accolades he adds "I think my most satisfying achievement was organising the conversion of ten natural gas-powered buses to diesel power in the Kefford era. SUSTAINABILITY



ELECTRIC BUS TRIAL: SHARING OUR EXPERIENCE TO DATE

As part of CDC's transition to Battery Electric Buses (BEBs) and to improve our environmental footprint, we have been trialling these buses since November 2022 at our Oakleigh depot, with support provided by the Department of Transport and Planning and Monash University.

We currently have 4 buses in service with an additional 4 buses in service by October. These are all Volvo BZL chassis with Volgren bodies (built in South Dandenong – as they build great buses and keep jobs local).

There are many benefits to operating a BEB, such as zero emissions at the tailpipe giving better air quality in our cities, noise reduction which increases passenger community comfort, reduced maintenance as there is no engine (and no waste oil), and a reduced reliance on the Diesel and AdBlue supply chain.

The BEB also generates electrical charge through Regenerative Braking, extending the time between charges.

As with any new technology, there are challenges. The main one is the charging time when compared to diesel buses. This can vary depending on how much charge is required, however, we can expect it to be over 2 hours if the battery is below 50% charge.



Here are a few details from our trial so far:
